On August 20, 2017, at about 4:17 PM, the Hudson Police Department and the Hudson Fire Department responded to Lowell Road near Market Basket for a report of a collision involving a small SUV and a motorcycle. Upon arrival, members of the Hudson Police Department and Hudson Fire Department attended to an injured motorcyclist and the operator of the SUV.

During the ensuing investigation, it was determined a 2009 Harley Davidson FLTR was traveling north on Lowell Road approaching the Lowell Road entrance to Market Basket. The Harley Davidson was operated by Daniel Boucher, 61 years old, of Nashua, NH. A 2003 Toyota RAV 4 was traveling south on Lowell Road approaching the same intersection. It was operated by Margaret Larocque, 85 years old, of Hudson, NH. The RAV 4 turned left towards the entrance of Market Basket and the two vehicles collided in the north bound lanes.

Due to the potential life threatening, serious injuries sustained by Mr. Boucher, the Hudson Fire Department coordinated a med-flight to pick him up at the parking lot St. Kathryn's Church in Hudson. Mr. Boucher was air-lifted to Brigham And Women's Hospital in Boston for treatment to his injuries. He was wearing a helmet at the time of the collision.

Ms. Larocque was transported to St. Joseph Hospital in Nashua for further evaluation. She was seat belted at the time of the crash.

The RAV 4 sustained moderate damage and the Harley Davidson sustained heavy damage. The road was partially closed with northbound detours while the Hudson Police Department investigated and reconstructed the collision. The cause is still under investigation. Both vehicles were later towed from the scene and the roadway was fully opened to traffic again.
