The Hudson Police Department wants to remind all citizens that beginning on December 1, 2017 a town-wide winter parking ban goes into effect. This means that vehicles are not allowed to be parked on public streets between the hours of 11:00 pm to 7:00 am. The reason for this parking ban is to enable the Department of Public Works to remove snow properly from the roadways in the event of an overnight snowstorm. Vehicles parked overnight on the roadways make it very difficult for DPW workers to remove the snow. This creates traffic issues and road hazards for those who commute to work during the morning hours. The Hudson Police Department will be issuing parking citations in the amount of \$20.00 for those parked on public roadways between the hours of 11:00 pm and 7:00 am. Any vehicle which is parked on a public roadway and interfering with active snow clearing operations can be fined \$100.00 and may be towed.

If the fine is not paid within 72 hours of the date issued, you may be summonsed to appear in the 9th Circuit Court - Nashua Division, and may be subject to pay the maximum fine allowed by law. Anyone cited for this parking violation should make their check payable to the Town of Hudson, New Hampshire. The Hudson Police Department would like to thank you in advance for not parking on the streets beginning December 1, 2017. The winter parking ban ends on March 30, 2018. All dates and fine schedules are in accordance with TOV's 317-15, 317-16, 317-17, 317-18 and 317-19 as defined in the Code of the Town of Hudson, New Hampshire.
