The Town of Hudson, New Hampshire wishes to engage the services of a qualified private firm to provide design and construction services of:

The CONTRACTOR must be lawfully engaged in the service of LINNING OF DRAINAGE MAINS in the State of New Hampshire.

PREPARATION OF PROPOSALS:

Proposals shall be submitted on the forms provided and must be signed by the Proposer or the Proposer's authorized representative. The person signing the proposal shall initial any corrections to entries made on the proposal forms.

Proposers must quote on all items appearing on the proposal forms. Failure to quote on all items may disqualify the proposal.

Unless otherwise stated in the Request for Proposal (RFP), the Proposer agrees that the proposal shall be deemed open for acceptance for sixty (60) calendar days subsequent to submittal to the Town of Hudson or as modified by addendum.

Any questions or inquiries must be submitted in writing, and must be received by the Town Engineer, Elvis Dhima (edhima@hudsonnh.gov) no later than seven (7) calendar days before the Request for Proposals due date to be considered. Any responses to questions, clarifications, or changes to the Request for Proposals will be provided to all Proposers of record that attended the mandatory pre-proposal meeting.

The Proposer shall not divulge, discuss or compare this proposal with other Proposers and shall not collude with any other Proposers or parties to a proposal whatever.

NON-MANDATORY PRE-BID MEETING:

All Proposers are required to attend the pre-proposal meeting at the site, 5 Adam Drive, at 11:00 AM on May 24, 2024.

SUBMISSION OF PROPOSALS:

Proposals must be submitted at the Clerk's Office, Town Hall Offices, 12 School Street, Hudson NH by 10:00 AM June 27, 2024, as directed in the Request for Proposals, and on the forms provided unless otherwise specified. Proposals must be typewritten or printed in ink. Proposals must be mailed, delivered in person or emailed to the Town Clerk.

BID BOND

Each Bidder shall accompany the proposal with a bid guarantee in the form of Cashier's Check, or a Certified Check payable to the Town of Hudson, or a Bid Bond secured by a guaranteed company or surety company licensed to operate in the State of New Hampshire in the amount of 5% of the Bid. (See Attached).

The bid guarantees of the unsuccessful Bidders shall be returned as soon as practicable.

Attorneys-in-fact who sign bid bonds or contract bonds must file with each bond a certified and effectively dated copy of their Power of Attorney.

AMENDMENTS TO PROPOSALS

If this solicitation is amended, then all terms and conditions which are not modified remain unchanged.

Proposers shall acknowledge receipt of any amendment to this solicitation (1) by identifying the amendment number and date on the Proposal form, or by letter. Proposals which fail to acknowledge the Proposer's receipt of any amendment will result in the rejection of the Proposal if the amendment(s) contained information which substantively changed the municipality's requirements.

Amendments will be on file in the offices of the municipality and the Engineer at least 1 day before Proposal opening.

WITHDRAWAL OF PROPOSALS:

Proposals may be withdrawn by written notice, telegram (including mailgram) or facsimile machine transmission received at any time before the exact time set for opening of proposals; provided that written confirmation of telegraphic or facsimile withdrawals over the signature of the proposer is mailed and postmarked prior to the specified proposal opening time. A

proposal may be withdrawn in person by a proposer or its authorized representative if, before the exact time set for opening of proposals, the identity of the person requesting withdrawal is established and the person signs a receipt for the proposal. Negligence on the part of the Proposer in preparing this proposal shall not constitute a right to withdraw a proposal subsequent to the proposal opening. Proposals may not be withdrawn for the period as indicated in this Request for Proposals or as modified by addenda.

RECEIPT AND OPENING OF PROPOSALS:

Proposals shall be submitted prior to the time fixed in the Request for Proposals. Proposals received after the time so indicated shall be returned unopened.

All qualified Bidders will receive consideration without regard to race, color, religion, creed, age, sex, or national origin.

PROPOSAL RESULTS:

All proposals received shall be considered confidential and not available for public review until after a contractor has been selected. All proposals may be subject to negotiations prior to the award of a contract.

NO TELEPHONE REQUESTS FOR RESULTS WILL BE ACCEPTED OR GIVEN.

TIE PROPOSALS:

When identical Proposals are received, with respect to price, delivery, financial resources, experience, ability to perform and quality, award may be made by a toss of a coin.

LIMITATIONS:

This Request for Proposal (RFP) does not commit the Town to award a contract, to pay any costs incurred in the preparation of a response to this request, or to procure or contract for services, supplies or equipment. The Town reserves the right to accept or reject any or all proposals received as a result of this request, or to cancel in part or in its entirety this RFP, if it is in the best interest of the Town to do so.

The OWNER reserves the right to waive any informalities, to negotiate with any Bidder and to reject any or all Bids. No Bidder may withdraw his Bid within ninety (90) days after the actual date of the opening thereof.

PROPOSAL EVALUATION:

In an attempt to determine if a Proposer is responsible, the Town, at its discretion, may obtain technical support from outside sources. Each Proposer will agree to fully cooperate with the personnel of such organizations.

PROJECT BACKGROUND

The Town is in need of lining 125 linear feet of sixty (60) inch RCP pipe under Adam Drive, which is approximately twenty five (25) feet deep

This project will be 100% funded by the Town of Hudson.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The Town of Hudson Engineering and Public Works Department is soliciting Contractor services for

LINING OF ADAM DRIVE CULVERT

The work will include the following:

- Cleaning and preparing of the culvert
- Installing UV liner
- Bypass NOT INCLUDED, to be provided by public works
- Provide specifications about the UV liner with a minimum thickens of 15.0 mm

All prices include mobilization, cleaning of existing main, liner, labor, etc. to provide a fully functioning main, once completed.

The existing drain must remain operational at all times during the construction unless directed by the Town Engineer in writing.

Proposers shall demonstrate experience in the design and installation of projects.

1. Description of Services Requested

Contractor will need to provide the Town with a written description of the proposed work for review and approval. The Contractor shall rehabilitate the structurally and/or functionally deteriorated sanitary sewer and/or storm water pipelines using the trenchless method of cured-in-place pipe (CIPP) by ultraviolet light cure in accordance with these Specifications. The CIPP material shall consist of a resin-impregnated fiberglass material tube ("Liner") which when cured shall extend the full length of the original pipe and provide a structurally sound, smooth, joint less and watertight pipe.

2. Time Frame for Performance of Services

A contract will be signed as soon as possible after the Proposal due date and completion of the Proposal evaluations, but no later than **July 1**, **2024** and the project will proceed immediately. The Contractor will be required to complete all work by **August 30**, **2024**.

BUDGET

The budget for the lining is \$150,000.

TRAFFIC CONTROL/MAINTENANCE

The Town reserves the right to hire Hudson Police Department or Highway Department staff directly to reduce the cost of the traffic control/maintenance, if necessary.

PROPOSAL STATEMENT PREPARATION

In order to facilitate the evaluation of the Proposals, the Proposer is instructed to follow the outline below in responding. Proposals that do not follow the outline, or do not contain the required information may be considered as unresponsive Proposals. Additional or more detailed information may be annexed to the main body of the Proposal. Proposals shall be submitted in **one (1) original and one (1) identical copy**.

1. Company or Contractor Team Background Material

The Proposer shall provide information concerning the background of the firm including a brief description of the firm's experience providing similar services. This shall include any proposed subcontractor or consultants that the Proposer plans to engage on this project.

2. Experience/References

The Proposer shall provide a Client reference list, with names, addresses, and telephone numbers, especially for clients whom the Proposer has provided similar services in the past. The Proposer shall demonstrate that a minimum of 50,000 ft., has been successfully performed by the Contractor's job Superintendent, who shall be assigned full time to this Project. The proposed CIPP Rehabilitation process shall be proven technology, which is defined as a minimum of 100,000 linear feet of successful sanitary sewer and/or storm water collection system installations in the U.S., documented to the satisfaction of the Owner.

3. Contractor Submittals

- A. The Contractor shall submit, prior to the installation or use of any lining materials or equipment, certified test results from the manufacturers which indicate that all materials conform to the applicable requirements.
- B. Chemical resistance submittals --- The Contractor shall submit test results of the resin proposed that meet the chemical resistance requirements of ASTM F2019, Section 5.2.6. The chemical resistance tests will be completed in accordance with Test Method D543.
- C. CIPP Field Samples ---Field sampling procedure shall be in accordance with ASTM 2019 and in accordance with ASTM D5813.

- D. MSDS Sheets --- The Contractor shall submit Material Safety Data Sheets for all resins, and other additives such as accelerants, colorants, and lubricants utilized in the pipe liner/lining process.
- E. Manufacturer Protocols The Contractor shall submit manufacturer information that describes the materials, curing speeds, curing installation processes, installation pressures, temperature limitations, and recommended post curing documentation.
- F. Residential Informational Handout The Contractor shall submit an informational hand out that describes the materials, processes, installation, pressures, temperature limitations, and odors associated with the lining process that shall be provided at the request of concerned residents.

4. Project Approach

The Proposer shall provide a cost, construction techniques, bypass pumps specification and proposed liner for the project. The Proposer shall also describe recent similar work and any other information that the Proposer deems relevant to the project, and which the Proposer believes will further the competitiveness of the Proposal, including work samples, pictures, etc. from similar completed projects.

5. Schedule

The Proposer shall provide a brief description of their ability to meet the construction schedule set forth in this Request for Proposal. In addition, the Proposer shall provide a proposed schedule of construction.

6. Cost Proposal

Proposers shall submit a Cost Proposal in Lump Sum not to exceed format.

7. Material

Neither the CIPP product, nor its installation, shall cause adverse effects to any of the Town processes or facilities. The use of the product shall not result in the formation or production of any detrimental compounds or by-products at the wastewater treatment plant. The Contractor shall notify the Town and identify any by products produced as a result of the operations, shall test and monitor the levels, and shall comply with any and all local waste discharge requirements.

8. Product Storage and Handling

All materials shall be accompanied by test reports certifying that the material conforms to the ASTM standards listed herein. Materials shall be shipped, stored, and handled in a manner consistent with written recommendations of the manufacturer. All damaged materials rejected by the Town Engineer shall be promptly removed from the project site at the Contractor's expense and disposed of in accordance with current applicable regulations.

9. Proposed Liner

The fiberglass within the Liner shall be non corrosion (E-CR Glass) material and shall be free from tears, holes, cuts, foreign materials and other surface defects. Its glass fibers must extend in a longitudinal direction to insure no longitudinal stretching during the pull-in process.

- A. The Liner shall be constructed to withstand installation pressures as required by Manufacturer's recommendations.
- B. The Liner shall be manufactured to a size that when installed will tightly fit the internal circumference and the length of the original pipe. The tube be able to stretch to fit irregular pipe sections and negotiate bends of up to 20 degrees and shall have sufficient strength to bridge missing pipe sections, with the use of a canvas sleeve if necessary.
- C. Interior and exterior plastics shall be styrene resistant to protect and contain the resin used in the Liner.
- D. The exterior plastic shall be ultra violet light resistant and translucent to allow visual inspection of the impregnation of the resin within the glass fibers.
- E. The wall color of the interior pipe surface of CIPP after installation shall be a light reflective color so that a clear detailed examination with CCTV inspection may be made.
- F. The nominal Liner wall thickness shall be constructed to the nearest 0.5mm increment

10. Resin

The resin used to impregnate the Liner shall produce a cured liner pipe resistant to shrinkage, corrosion, abrasion and shall have a proven resistance to municipal wastewater. The resin shall be a chemically resistant UV cured isophthalic polyester resin or vinyl ester resin (as determined by the Engineer). When cured the resin/Liner system shall meet the structural and chemical resistance requirements of ASTM F2019.

11. CIPP Structural Requirements

A. The thickness of each Liner installed shall be determined using calculation methods that are consistent with applicable ASTMs. The Contractor shall submit stamped and signed designs prior to the installation of any Liner. The designs shall include a step by step calculation that shows all equations, defines all variables, lists all assumptions, and clearly indicates all values used for the design.

B. The design engineer shall set the lon 1 g term (50 year extrapolated) Creep Retention Factor at 50% of the initial design flexural modulus as determined by ASTM D790 test method.

C. The cured in place pipe material (CIPP) shall conform to the structural properties as listed on Minimum Physical Properties.

12. Minimum Physical Properties

Wall Thickness: ASTM D2122 per ASTM F2019 Flexural Modulus of Elasticity ASTM D-790

(short term): 725,000 psi

Flexural Strength ASTM D-790: 6,500 psi

The required structural CIPP wall thickness shall be based as a minimum on the physical properties indicated above, the Design Equations in the appendix of ASTM F1216, and the following design parameters:

Design Safety Factor 2.0

Creep Retention Factor 60% (UV fiberglass liners typically tests at >65%)

Ovality 2%

Modulus of passive soil reaction 1000 psi Groundwater Depth Assume at surface

Poisson's ratio of 0.3 Live Load H-20 (Highway Loading) Soil Load 120 lb/cu. Ft. Pipe Condition Fully Deteriorated Minimum service life 50 years

13. Preparatory Work

A. The Contractor shall verify the lengths of pipe to be relined and the inside diameters

B. The fabric tube shall be fully impregnated with resin (wet-out). The impregnation equipment shall contain devices to secure a proper distribution of the resin. Following the impregnation, the fabric tube shall be exposed to a resin thickening procedure. Certification documentation concerning date, type of resin (manufacturer, trade name and lot number), resin calculation, and volume of resin used shall be attached to the impregnated fabric tube.

14. Pipe Liner Installation

The CIPP Liner shall be installed in the host pipe per the manufacturer's specifications as submitted in these Specifications. CIPP installation shall be in accordance with applicable ASTM F2019, Section 6.4, and the following:

- A. Final Cleaning and Inspection -- The existing host pipe shall be cleaned just prior to insertion of the Liner. A maximum of one hour may elapse between this final cleaning/flushing pass and the insertion of the Liner. After the cleaning is complete, a recorded video inspection shall be made to verify the cleanliness of the line, shall be available to the Engineer upon request.
- B. Liner protection --- Prior to inserting the Liner, a plastic sheet 10 mil thick will be pulled into the host pipe to protect the Liner from damage as the Liner is pulled in.
- C. Liner Insertion --- The Liner shall be pulled-in through an existing manhole or approved access point and fully extend to the next designated manhole or termination point. The pulling speed shall not exceed 15 ft./min. Care shall be exercised not to damage the tube during the pulling phase.
- D. Liner Inflation --- The Liner shall then be inflated with air with sufficient pressure to hold the Liner tight to the host pipe wall.
- E. Liner Inspection --- The Contractor will video record the Liner prior to commencement of the curing process, and make the recording available to the Engineer upon request.

15. Curing for Ultraviolet Light

CIPP curing shall be in accordance with applicable ASTM F2019, Section 6.6 and 6.7, with the following modifications:

- A. the ultraviolet curing lamps shall operate in a sufficient frequency range to insure the curing of the resin.
- B. A camera must be located on the ultraviolet light assembly to enable the video inspection of the Liner and to insure that the Liner has been properly inflated and any liner problems can be identified before curing begins.
- C. The Contractor will submit a documented record of time, rate of travel of the ultraviolet light assembly, and internal temperatures and pressures during the curing process to the Engineer upon request.

16. Finished Pipe Liner

- A. The cured Liner shall be continuous over the entire length of an installation run and be free of material defects. The lining shall be impervious and free of any leakage from the pipe to the surrounding ground or from the ground to inside the lined pipe.
- C. Any defect, which will or could affect the structural integrity, strength, capacity, or future maintenance of the installed Liner, shall be repaired at the Contractor's expense, in a manner approved by the Engineer.

D. Both ends of the cured Liner shall be cut flush at the inlet and outlet points in the manhole, and sealed with an epoxy or resin mixture compatible with the Liner/resin system, providing a watertight seal. Sealing material and installation method shall be submitted and approved by the Town Engineer prior to start of construction. Hydraulic cements and quick-set cement products are not acceptable.

17. Internal Reinstatement of Side Sewers

After the Liner has been properly cured, the Contractor shall internally reinstate the existing side sewer and or drainage laterals. Internal reinstatement of laterals shall be performed by a qualified individual with experience in successful internal lateral cuttings. The cutting device shall produce a neat, clean and smooth opening of at least 95% of the existing side sewer lateral circumference.

18. Lateral Seals When Applicable

If there is negligible shrinkage of UV fiberglass liners after curing, and if the liners are of such strength that roots are not able to affect them, no lateral seals are required to be made except when there is damage to the lateral itself. Only those laterals identified by the Town Engineer as defective and needing seals will be sealed by the contractor.

19. Final Acceptance

- A. The Contractor shall perform a CCTV inspection in accordance with ASTM F2019, section 7.3 after installation of the CIPP Liner and reconnection of the active side sewer /drainage laterals. The quality of the post-installation CCTV inspection shall be held to the same standards as the pre-installation CCTV inspection.
- B. The Contractor shall submit to the Engineer, for acceptance and approval, two (2) copies of unedited post-installation thumb drive and associated curing reports for each sewer / drainage main segment within 10 working days of the Liner installation. No more than one sewer /drainage main segment shall be included on a post-installation Inspection thumb drive or curing report.

20. Sampling and Laboratory Testing

The physical properties of the installed CIPP Liner shall meet the minimum physical properties per Section CIPP Structural Requirements line 3 above, verified through field sampling and laboratory testing.

Per Section 8 of ASTM F1216 and ASTM F1743, the Contractor shall obtain samples from all actual installed CIPP Liners. All samples shall be labeled with the following: **Date of installation**

Main segment number

AWARD OF CONTRACT:

Any contract entered into by the Town shall be in response to the proposal and subsequent discussions. It is the policy of the Town that contracts be awarded, among other considerations, only to responsive and responsible Proposers. In order to qualify as responsive and responsible, a prospective Engineering Firm/Contractor must meet the following standards as they relate to this request:

- Have adequate financial resources for performance or have the ability to obtain such resources as required during performance;
- Have the necessary experience, organization, technical and professional qualifications, skills and facilities;
- Be able to comply with the proposed or required time of completion or performance schedule;
- Have a demonstrated satisfactory record of performance.
- Adhere to the specifications of this proposal and provide all documentation required of this proposal

The contract will be awarded to a responsive and responsible Proposer based on the cost and experience of the engineering firm /contractor and schedule.

The Town reserves the right to reject any or all proposals or any part thereof, to waive any formality, information and/or errors in the proposal, to accept any proposal in part or in whole as may be in the best interest of the Town, or any other option if it is considered in the best interest of the Town to do so.

This solicitation requires proposing on all items, failure to do so will disqualify the proposal.

CONTRACT AWARD PROTEST POLICY AND PROCEDURE:

- a. Definitions. As used in this provision:
 - "Interested party" means an actual or prospective bidder whose direct economic interest would be affected by the award of the contract.
 - "Protest" means a written objection by an interested party to this solicitation or to a proposed or actual award of a contract pursuant to this solicitation.
- b. Protests shall be served on the Contracting Officer by obtaining written and dated acknowledgement from:

Steve Malizia, Town Administrator Town of Hudson 12 School Street Hudson, NH 03051 c. All protests shall be resolved in accordance with the municipality's protest policy and procedures, copies of which are maintained at the municipality.

MODIFICATIONS AFTER AWARD:

The Contract shall constitute the entire understanding between the parties, and it shall not be considered modified, altered, changed, or amended in any respect unless in writing and signed by the parties hereto. Such modification shall be in the form of a contract amendment executed by both parties.

CANCELLATION OF AWARD:

The Town reserves the right to cancel the award without liability to the Proposer at any time before a contract has been fully executed by all parties and is approved by the Town.

CONTRACT:

Any Contract between the Town and the Contractor shall consist of (1) the Request for Proposal (RFQ) and any amendments thereto and (2) the Contractor's proposal in response to the RFQ, (3) Form of Agreement. In the event of a conflict in language between documents (1), (2), and (3) referenced above, the provisions and requirements set forth and referenced in the RFB shall govern. However, the Town reserves the right to clarify any contractual relationship in writing and such written clarification shall govern in case of conflict. In all other matters, not affected by written clarification, if any, the RFQ shall govern. The Proposer is cautioned that this proposal shall be subject to acceptance without further clarification.

EXECUTION OF CONTRACT:

The successful Proposer shall sign (execute) the contract documents and shall satisfy all conditions set forth in the contract to enter into the contract and return such signed documents to the Town, within ten (10) calendar days from the date mailed or otherwise delivered to the successful Proposer.

APPROVAL OF CONTRACT:

Upon receipt of the contract that has been fully executed by the successful Proposer, the Town shall complete the execution of the contract in accordance with local laws or ordinances and return the fully executed contract to the Contractor. Delivery of the fully executed contract, along with a Notice to Proceed and a Town purchase order, to the Contractor shall constitute the Town's approval of the contract with the Contractor.

FAILURE TO EXECUTE CONTRACT:

Failure of the successful Proposer to execute the contract within ten (10) calendar days from the date mailed or otherwise delivered to the successful Proposer shall be just cause for cancellation of the award.

DISQUALIFICATION:

Awards will not be made to any person, firm and/or corporation that has defaulted upon a contract with the Town, the State of New Hampshire or the Federal Government within the past 5 years. Awards will not be made to any principal owner or officers that have a 10% or greater interest in a firm or corporation that has defaulted upon a contract with the Town, the State of New Hampshire or the Federal Government within the past 5 years. Corporations must currently be in good standing with the Secretary of State's Office in the state of incorporation.

INSURANCE:

The successful Proposer shall procure and maintain insurance, in the amounts and coverage as set forth in this Request for Proposals, or otherwise required by the Town, at the Proposer's sole expense, with Town approved insurance companies, insuring against any and all public liability, including injuries or death to persons and damage to property, arising out of or related to the goods or Proposer's performance hereunder and shall furnish to the Town certificates of such insurance and renewals thereof signed by the issuing company or agent upon the Town's request. Such certificates shall name the Town of Hudson as an additional insured. Such policies shall provide for cancellation only subsequent to 30 days prior written notice to the Town and proof of subsequent insurance upon cancellation of prior policy.

The Town's examination of, or failure to request or demand, any evidence of insurance hereunder, shall not constitute a waiver of any requirement and the existence of any insurance shall not limit the Proposer's obligation under any provision hereof.

Except to the extent of comparable insurance acceptable to, or express waiver by the Town, the Proposer shall, or shall cause any carrier engaged by the Proposer, to insure all shipments of goods for full value.

If the contract with the Proposer involves the performance of work by the Proposer's employees at property owned or leased by the Town, the Proposer shall furnish such additional insurance as the Town may request in respect thereof, but in any event and without such request, workers' compensation insurance and unemployment compensation insurance as required by laws of the State of New Hampshire and public and automotive liability and property damage insurance. In no event shall such employees of the Proposer be deemed to be the employees of, or under the direction or control of the Town for any purpose whatsoever.

The Engineering firm will carry Professional Liability Insurance up to the cost of the project in addition to general liability insurance carried from the contractor.

PERFORMANCE BOND

Unless specifically waived in the Proposal, upon execution of the Contract, the successful bidder shall furnish the Town with a surety bond or bonds equal to the sum of 100 percent of the Contract amount. If a bond is used, it shall meet the following requirements:

- a. The form of the bond(s) shall be acceptable to the Town (See attached), and
- b. The bonding company issuing the bond(s) shall be licensed to transact business in the State of New Hampshire, and
- c. The bonding company issuing the bond(s) shall be listed on the current list of "Companies Holding Certificates of Authority as Acceptable Sureties on Federal Bonds and as Acceptable Reinsuring Companies," as published by the United States Department of the Treasury, Fiscal Service, Circular 570.

The Bonds shall guarantee the execution, faithful performance, and completion of the work to be done under the Contract, and payment in full of all bills and accounts for materials and labor used in the work. In the event the surety or bonding company fails or becomes financially insolvent, the Contractor shall file a new bond(s) in the amount designated by the Town, within 30 calendar days of such failure or insolvency.

Each bond shall clearly state the rate of premium and the total amount of premium charged. The current power of attorney for the person who signs for the surety company must be attached to the bond. The effective date of the power of attorney shall not precede the date of the bond. The effective date of the bond shall be on or after the execution date of the contract.

Failure by the successful bidder to obtain the required assurance of completion within the time specified, or within such extended period as the municipality may grant based upon reasons determined adequate by the municipality, shall render the bidder ineligible for award. The municipality may then either award the contract to the next responsible bidder or solicit new bids. The municipality may retain the ineligible bidder's bid guarantee.

DISAGREEMENTS AND DISPUTES:

All disagreements and disputes, if any, arising under the terms of any contract, either by law, in equity, or by arbitration, shall be resolved pursuant to the laws and procedures of the State of New Hampshire, in which state any contract shall be deemed to have been executed. No action at law, or equity, or by arbitration shall be commenced to resolve any disagreements or disputes under the terms of any contract, in any jurisdiction whatsoever other than the State of New Hampshire and Hillsborough County.

TERMINATION OF CONTACT FOR CAUSE:

If the Contractor shall violate any provision of the Contract, the Town shall have the right to terminate the Contract. To terminate the Contract, the Town shall provide written notice to the Contractor of such termination. Such written notice shall state the Contract violation(s) and be delivered to the Contractor's address as identified in the Contract Documents. This notice shall provide the Contractor with fifteen (15) calendar days from the date of delivery, to correct the violation(s) to the Town's satisfaction. Should the Contractor fail to satisfactorily correct all violations within (15) fifteen calendar days, the Town may terminate the contract immediately upon delivery of a Notice of Termination to the Contractor. Such termination shall become effective immediately or as otherwise determined by the Town. Upon termination, all finished or unfinished work, services, plans, data programs and reports

prepared by the Contractor under the Contract shall become the Town's property. The Town may also terminate this Contract in accordance with any other applicable Contract provision.

Notwithstanding the above, the Contractor shall not be relieved of liability to the Town for damages sustained by the Town by virtue of any breach of any contract, and the Town may withhold any payments until such time as the exact amount of damages due the Town is determined.

TERMINATION FOR THE CONVENIENCE OF THE TOWN:

The Town may terminate any contract at any time by giving written notice to the Vendor of such termination and specifying the effective date thereof, at least fifteen (15) days before the effective date of such termination.

In that event, all finished or unfinished work, services, documents and materials shall become the Town's property. If any Contract is terminated by the Town as provided herein, the Vendor will be paid an amount which bears the same ratio to the total compensation as the services covered by any contract, less payments of compensation previously made.

PATENT PROTECTION:

The successful Proposer agrees to indemnify and defend the Town of Hudson from all claims and losses resulting from alleged and actual patent infringements and further agrees to hold the Town of Hudson harmless from any liability arising under RSA 382-A, 2-312 (3). (Uniform Commercial Code).

OWNERSHIP OF REPORTS:

All data, materials, plans, reports and documentation prepared pursuant to any contract between the Town of Hudson and the successful Proposer shall belong exclusively to the Town.

ASSIGNMENT PROVISION:

The successful Proposer hereby agrees that it will assign to the Town of Hudson all cause of action that it may acquire under the anti-trust laws of New Hampshire and the United States as the result of conspiracies, combination of contracts in restraint of trade which affect the price of goods or services obtained by the Town under this contract if so requested by the Town of Hudson.

PAYMENT:

OWNER and CONTRACTOR, in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, agree as follows:
ARTICLE 1 - WORK
CONTRACTOR shall complete all Work as specified or indicated in the Contract Documents. The Work is generally described as follows:

ARTICLE 2 - ENGINEER
The Project is being managed by the Town Engineer with assistance from
, who is to act as OWNER's representative, assume all duties and responsibilities and have the rights and authority assigned to ENGINEER in the Contract Documents in connection with completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents.
ARTICLE 3 - CONTRACT PRICE

- 7.6 CONTRACTOR has given ENGINEER written notice of all conflicts, errors, ambiguities or discrepancies that CONTRACTOR has discovered in the Contract Documents and the written resolution thereof by ENGINEER is acceptable to CONTRACTOR, and the Contract Documents are generally sufficient to indicate and convey understanding of all terms and conditions for performance and furnishing of the Work.

- Question 1: Is the original spec with the UV Fiberglass liner still the product requested?
- Answer 1: Yes, Fiberglass Liner is the product the Town requires.
- Question 2: Please confirm the contractor is allowed to release filtered water removed during the pipe vacuuming process (known as "decant water") into the sanitary or storm system?
- Answer 2: Decant water removed from the sanitary system CAN be discharged back into the sanitary system
- Question 3: If the decant water is to be released to the sanitary system, please confirm the sanitary sewer operator has granted permission?
- Answer 3: Decant water removed from the surface drain system CAN be discharged back into the surface drain system ONLY if the vac truck has been properly disinfected and certified PRIOR to any cleaning operations in the surface drain system. If at any point the truck had been used to clean and vacuum from a sanitary sewer system, the truck will need to undergo a disinfecting procedure and be certified PRIOR to engaging in any cleaning operations in the surface drain. The contractor will be allowed to discharge surface drain decant water into the sanitary sewer system, if necessary
- Question 4: If the decant water is to be released to the storm system, please provide a copy of the MS4 permit?
- Answer 5: See attachments.
- Question 5: Please confirm that the water introduced for the pipe jetting process is allowed to remain in the storm system.
- Answer 6: This is acceptable provided the water used to clean the pipes is taken from an approved hydrant. Contractor shall be responsible for coordination with Hudson Engineering Department the use of any hydrants.
